The 4 C's

1. Control the source
2. Contain the spill to small area
3. Comply w/ reporting requirements
4. Clean up

Spill Response Procedures

1. Personal safety first! *Operate only within your capabilities and your level of training.*
2. Control/Stop the source, if possible
3. Contain the spill to a small area
4. Prevent contact with surface and ground water
5. Notification Procedures
 - ➔ **Notify Local Emergency Response Personnel, if needed**
 - 911 ➔ Fire - Police - Ambulance - Health - LEPC - Doctor
 - Local Emergency Planning Committee (through Local Emergency Mgmt Coord)
 - ➔ **MDA Agriculture Pollution Emergency Hotline (800-405-0101)**
 - ALL pesticide, fertilizer, and manure spills
 - Remediation and land application options and technical assistance
 - ➔ **National Response Center (800-424-8802)**
 - If Reportable Quantity is exceeded ➔ Sara Title III - Haz Matls - EHS
 - ➔ **MDEQ Pollution Emergency Alerting System Hotline (800-292-4706)**
 - ALL non-agricultural spills
